

Quarantine & Isolation Protocol Quick Reference Sheet

What should I do if...



Not Vaccinated

COVID Positive healthcare provider test, symptoms present (MCSD does not accept home tests)

solate for minimum of 10 days, longer if symptoms

Fully Vaccinated

Isolate for minimum of 10 days, longer if symptoms persist.

COVID Positive healthcare provider test, NO symptoms present

solate for minimum of 10

Isolate for minimum of 10 days from the date of testing

positive person wearing a mask are NOT required to

Close Contact with a COVID positive person

Household close

Contact of a COVID

positive person

Monitor for symptoms for 14 days.

Quarantine for 14 days. School nurses can provide options for a shortened quarantine*

20 day quarantine if positive person isolates.

No quarantine required. 24 davs

STUDENTS wearing a mask and more than 3 feet from a positive student wearing a mask are NOT required to quarantine

STAFF wearing a

mask and more than

6 feet from a

quarantine

Close Contact of a close contact

No quarantine required

*If a shortened quarantine is chosen, the student must wear a mask at school for the remainder of the 14 days from exposure to a positive case.

Important Definitions

Quarantine: Individuals in quarantine should stay home and avoid contact with other people until the guarantine period is over. This includes members of the household.

Isolation: Someone infected with COVID 19 with our without symptoms, separates from people who are not infected. They must remain at home and avoid contact with other people until their isolation period is over, including members of their household

Close contact: DHEC defines close contacts among students in the school setting as unvaccinated students who were within 3 feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24 hour period.

The parent/guardian of any student who has been in close contact with an infected individual will be notified by the school nurse that their student is subject to state-mandated quarantine procedures as outlined above.
